From the Deputy Head of College

Home Groups and Wellbeing

During Home Group time, key operational messages are shared with students as well as wellbeing concepts and lessons.

The theory of the Dipper and the Bucket was one of these concepts covered this week. It has a very simple message, but one that is relevant for all of us and definitely for the boys to consider as they start to develop their emotional intelligence and self-awareness. It comes from Tom Rath and Donald Clifton's book, How Full is Your Bucket? It also supports well our mission at Waverley of trying to live our lives by the Gospels, to love and to look for the best in people, no matter what their background.

'Each of us has an invisible bucket. It is constantly emptied or filled, depending on what others say or do to us. When our bucket is full, we feel great. When it's empty, we feel awful.

Each of us also has an invisible dipper. When we use that dipper to fill other people's buckets – by saying or doing things to increase their positive emotions – we also fill our own bucket. But when we use that dipper to dip from others' buckets – by saying or doing things that decrease their positive emotions – we diminish ourselves.

A full bucket gives us a positive outlook and renewed energy. Every drop in that bucket makes us stronger and more optimistic. But an empty bucket poisons our outlook, saps our energy, and undermines our will. That's why every time someone dips from our bucket, it hurts us.

So we face a choice every moment of every day. We can fill one another's buckets, or we can dip from them. It's an important choice – one that profoundly influences our relationships, productivity, health, and happiness.'

Uniform Change

One of the skills we want the boys to develop is their ability to adapt and respond to different stimulus and conditions. This week we asked them to carry out a pretty simple task in response to the hot conditions, wear their correct sports uniform to school and 95% of them adapted very well. We were also sending them a message, that we are responsive, thinking about their learning environment and their welfare, which are important messages for them to hear from their school.

Another skill we want our Waverley Gentlemen to possess is good sportsmanship. As we approach the CAS swimming competition (10 March) some of our boys will have an opportunity to represent their school in competition to the best of their abilities. Others will represent the school up in the stands cheering on their mates and fellow students. How we compete and cheer says a lot about us, whether we win or lose. These messages will be explored as we approach the big day

Consequences for choices made

The detention policy has been tweaked as follows: Students need to ensure they bring meaningful work along to detention that they can progress. This may include - assignment work, homework, taking notes from a source, planning an essay, writing an oral, reading an English novel and taking notes. During the week, laptops are not to be

brought along to detention. The work must involve written work or a combination of reading/writing/ highlighting. Boys may bring laptops along to a Saturday detention to assist with research over the longer period.

Once a detention has been issued, students have the ability to negotiate with their Head of Year a different day in that same week to complete their responsibilities. However, should a student not then turn up to the detention, a Saturday detention will be automatically issued. If the detention not turned up to is a Saturday detention, then two Saturday detentions will be automatically issued.

Boys need to understand consequences for not delivering or fronting up. They have an opportunity to negotiate the most suitable day, they then need to step up to the mark and make that commitment. This is good preparation for the broader world they are working themselves towards. Just like a physio appointment that is booked, you get a reminder to commit to that appointment or you will be charged for it anyway if you do not turn up. We want to be teaching and preparing boys for the world they are going to be soon independently working and living


Linger:

For our Year 12 players, it will be their penultimate game for the College, so we are encouraging as many spectators as possible to make it to All Sorts, Alexandria to support the 1st V and 2nd

Waverley teams to win on the weekend included: 9Cs (35-24), 8Cs (27-26), 8Ds (30-27), 7As (27-24), 7Cs (52-9), 7Ds (31-13), 7Es (26-18), 7Fs (10-9) and 7Gs (16-15) while the 8As drew 39-all. The 9Bs (25-20), 8Bs (32-31), 8Fs (25-17) and 7Bs (34-30) all lost close games.

With the loss to Barker, the 10As now have a 5-3 winloss record for the season, while the 9As (4-4), 9Fs (4-4), 8As (4-1-3), 8Cs (4-4) are still travelling well. The 7As (2-1), 7Cs (3-0), 7Ds (3-0), 7Fs (2-1) and 7Gs (2-0) are also doing very well.

The end-of-season awards ceremony for basketball will once again be in a different format than usual this year due to the ongoing building works and lack of appropriate facilities at the College. Only players from the 1st V, 2nd V, A and B teams and departing Year 12 players will participate in a short presentation from 5pm in the College Canteen on Friday 11th of March. Light food and drink will be provided for the players. All other award winners will be presented with their certificates during the last round of the season, either at training or after the game against St Aloysius on Saturday 5th of March.

Private lessons cannot be cancelled during term. Students must be committed to learning the instrument for the entire semester. In the event of a student wishing to cease tuition, one full term's notice is required in writing.


