Laptop Rollout

At the start of the school vear students in Year 5 will be issued new Macbook computers as part of the Waverley College iLearn initiative. To facilitate this, you and your son are asked to attend a deployment afternoon on Wednesday 10th February 2016 commencing at 3.15pm at the Junior School site, this will run until approximately 4.45pm.

At the deployment afternoon your son will be issued with a new device once you have signed off on a copy of the iLearn contract that will be provided at the start of the session. Attached is a copy of the contract template for your information.

To avoid congestion and to make the process of collecting the laptops easier please note where to go on the deployment afternoon: If your son is in -

- 5 Green go to 5 Green sign the contract and collect the laptop then proceed to the auditorium.
- 5 Gold go to 6 Green sign the contract and collect the laptop then proceed to the auditorium.
- 5 Red go to the library sign the contract and collect the laptop then proceed to the auditorium.
- 5 Blue go to Art • room sign the contract and collect the laptop then proceed to the auditorium.
- 5 White go to 6 White sign the contract and collect the laptop then proceed to the auditorium.

From the Deputy Head of College

Setting yourself up well for learning

The boys have been back at school for a week now and we are hoping they are getting into good routines and habits.

Sleep and diet are significant contributors to good performance for your son at school. Please be vigilant in setting clear boundaries around device usage prior to bedtime and also ensuring he has a balanced diet. If he is not starting the day well rested and fueled up, he is going to struggle through six and half hours of school. He is then going to struggle to do any meaningful study that night and bad habits can form that are hard to break.

Leading adolescent psychologist, Dr Michael Carr-Gregg sees sleep 'as the most important study tool going around'. He goes on to say that insufficient sleep means that teens not only perform worse in the short term, but there are long term implications. Stage 5 sleep, is the time when the brain consolidates the information that is being taken during the day, and if the boys do not get enough stage 5 sleep, they are simply not going to be able to process the information and consolidate it. This is compounded if boys then skip breakfast.

Sleep deprivation and a lack of energy is not how we want Waverley boys turning up to school. Please be proactive as parents/guardians in this area.

Opal Cards

Boys should be tapping on and off with their Opal cards whilst travelling on public transport. If you have not received a card as yet, you should apply online at transportnsw.info/school-students if you are eligible.

It is very important that boys tap on and off with their cards, particularly on buses as the government makes decisions on which bus routes to keep and change based on usage.

Behaviour at Sport

The boys have been encouraged to play hard, but play fair when it comes to sport whilst representing their College.

We want our boys to develop good team skills and learn how to respond well when things do not go their way. We have encouraged them to be gracious in accepting the umpire's decision even if they think/know they are right. There are certainly too many poor errors in judgement being made by some of the nation's professional sports persons, who should be better role models for our youth.

However, I prefer to highlight the ones that have been great role models and highly successful as well. Players like Andrew Gaze (basketball), Adam Gilchrist (cricket), Steve Waugh (cricket), Michelle Timms (basketball), Libby Trickett (swimming) and Anna Meares (cycling) to name a few. They all seem to have kept their integrity in tact and modelled positive behaviours in pressure situations.

Please encourage your son to strive to be a good sportsman.

Litter and Uniform

We are focusing on wearing our uniform with pride and also treating our learning and and playing environment better. Both areas are a working progress, but I would appreciate your support from home.

IT Alert: Recall of Apple Wall Socket Power Adaptors

As you may have seen published in the press recently Apple have announced a worldwide recall of certain wall socket power adapters that were issued with Apple products.

Waverley iAssist have worked with Apple to setup a process to replace any affected adapters that may have been issued with student Macbook Airs as follows:

Step 1 - Families should go to https://www.apple.com/au/ support/ac-wallplug-adapter/ which will explain the adapters effected and how to identify.

Step 2 - If you have an affected adapter you can bring this to E15 where iAssist will replace with a new one (iAssist will have stock of replacement adapters early next week)

From the Director of Curriculum: Honouring our high achievers

High Achievers Assembly 2016 – "...an education received within these Waverley walls is an education to be prized above all." Adam Hegedus - Class of 2015

Inspiration, commitment and hard work was personified on Thursday 4 February as Year 12 students, staff, parents and members of the Waverley community gathered in the PAC to welcome back and celebrate our high academic achievers from the Class of 2015.

Not only were we very proud to acknowledge the individual achievement of each of these 40 young men, we were delighted to hear from two of our high achievers at this event. Thank you to both Stefan Kovacevic and Adam Hegedus who shed light on their study habits and offered some wonderful words of advice to our student body.

Stefan spoke passionately about his time at Waverley College, highlighting the importance of choosing subjects that you enjoy. He entertained us with school anecdotes and offered words of encouragement to the Year 12 students sitting before him. He attributes much of his success to three qualities: "moral support, determination and persistence".

Stefan's address was truly inspiring and his full address will be published shortly.

We wish him every success as he heads to Canberra to embark on a double degree in Business and Science at the Australian National University.

It was with great pleasure to award Adam Hegedus with the plaque of Highest ATAR 2015 (99.85). In addition to that, Adam was the recipient of 1st in State for Studies of Religion 2 and 15th in State for Business Studies. Both these outstanding achievements are a testament to his commitment and focus.

He was offered a dual scholarship at the University of NSW, and received the Academic Achievement Award from them. He has since accepted the highly sort University of NSW Co-Op Scholarship to study Commerce, majoring in Information Systems and Management. This scholarship is only awarded to 5 students each year. With 855 applicants nation wide who must have a minimum ATAR of 96, this is a stellar achievement.

Adam spoke eloquently about his time at Waverley. He felt honoured to be speaking at the Assembly, commenting that the High Achiever Assemblies were "always one of my favourite days on the school calendar as I could come in and aspire to be like those who had walked this stage on this very occasion each year." He was proud to echo the wise words of high achiever 2014, Jonathon Hetherington, that the HSC is a year of "sacrifice, resilience and perseverance". Adam commended his peers on the cohort's collective efforts and hard work, reinforcing the importance of collaboration.

Recently Adam walked for 21 days from Waverley College to Byron Bay with Alessandro Piovano and raised \$20 000 which will go towards building a school in Timor-Leste. They were inspired by the Timor-Leste immersion they experienced here at Waverley College and both have aspirations to one day establish an official charity that supports Education in Timor for many years to come.

He reflected on this walk and compared it to the journey that students will travel in Year 12:

'The last time I entered the doors of the College was when Alexi and I began our leisurely stroll to Byron Bay. In short, as you can imagine, it was the hardest task that we have both ever completed, besides the HSC Legal Paper. After all, you never know what you are made of until you are stuck with Alexi for 21 days. In between us and our goal was a mere 758km. This distance is very much like the hallway between the start of year 12 and your last exam. At times, people doubted us and our sanity, yet, we knew deep down that there was a chance to reach our goals, whether that be building a new school in Timor-Leste or achieving a certain ATAR, with simply sacrifice, resilience and perseverance. Personally, the events that I saw in Timor-Leste in 2014 helped me make the most of my education here at Waverley, as did several other high achievers today.

"Day eight of the walk was much like the day before HSC examinations. It was 6PM as the sun began to fall. Our bodies were deflated from the eight hours of walking clocking close to 30KM. We could have easily packed up and settled, but we wanted to reach our intended target for the day which seemed almost unrealistic at this point. The pair of us failed to see the 20KM that stood between our current position and utopia. For these 20KMs we walked in the pitch black through the forest, with no reception to call for help, a mere 1L of water and a packet of sultanas. The final year may seem exactly like this at times, where time is running out and life itself is going against you and all you have left is a handful of old sultanas. Yet, this is when the experiences at the College come into play. As former school captain Ruairi Biollo stated "It isn't everyday you get to visit Timor-Leste or stay in a hostel in Walgett".

"In the early hours of the morning we arrived at our destination, signaling a truck for help in the form of food and water, similar to the times when we called upon our teachers throughout the year."

We wish to congratulate the entire HSC class of 2015 on their excellent results and wish them all the best in their future endeavors. I'll conclude with Adam's parting words at today's Assembly.

"Finally, I hope as you leave today, you are left not just with an appreciation but, with a personal determination that an education received within these Waverley walls is an education to be prized above all."

Elite Sportsperson meeting the balance between School and Training

Last month, Year 8 student Will Cooley was selected to represent Australia at the Optimist Sailing World Championships in Vilamoura, Portugal.

Will, who has only been sailing for four years out of the Woollahra Sailing Club, finished third overall out of 124 competitors in the Open Fleet division at the Australian Optimist National Championship to qualify for selection.

The Optimist World Championship is the premier regatta for elite level junior sailors worldwide. The top 5 junior sailors of 58 countries from 5 continents compete to become world champion. Selection in the Australian Optimist Sailing Team requires a significant training commitment both locally and internationally.

Will's schedule leading up to the competition in Portugal is a full one with lead up competitions in Auckland, Adelaide and Singapore. Keeping this in mind, a balance needed to be established between Will's commitments at Waverley College and his sailing aspirations.

At the College, Will is a keen participant in water polo and football in our co-Curricular program.

Like all elite athletes who attend Waverley College, Will was granted an exemption for two Saturdays in 2016. As indicated at the point of enrolment and reinforced in the Head of College's letter home at the start of this year, students are entitled to apply in writing for a maximum of two Saturday exemptions from their co-curricular commitment each year.

On behalf of the College community I would like to wish Will every success as he prepares for, and competes in the Optimist World Championship later this year.

From the Head of Learning Support

Waverley College, along with all Australian schools, will be carrying out a process of Nationally Consistent Collection of Data for Student with Disabilities - a count of the number of students who are supported under the school's obligations to comply with the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and Disability Standards for Education 2005.

The count is based on the professional judgment of teachers and their knowledge and understanding of students.

The process assists the school in identifying and supporting students with disabilities so we can put adjustments in place to enable them to access and participate in education on the same basis as their peers.

The data collected is not identifiable to individual students. Information collected relates to the numbers of students involved; the types of adjustments provided, including curriculum delivery, medical support, health and safety, social skills and communication; the level of adjustment provided and the categories of disabilities.

In the first instance, the information is submitted to the Catholic Education Commission then forwarded, as non-identifiable data, to the Australian Government Education Council (ie student names will not be captured). The information collected is protected by the Privacy Act. The information collected may be used for the school's future funding and policy requirements.






