Career Hotspot ... Cartographer

Cartographers design, prepare and revise maps, charts, plans, three dimensional models and spatial information. They produce paper maps and web-designed electronic maps using desktop publishing and analyse and interpret information from a range of sources.

Personal Requirements:

- Enjoy design and computer graphics
- Enjoy geography
- Able to work neatly and accurately, paying attention to detail
- Good at mathematics and science
- Able to work as part of a team

Education and Training:

A Diploma or advanced Diploma in mapping science is needed to become a cartographer. Entry level to these degrees requires the completion of the HSC with prerequisite subjects in Mathematics, biology, chemistry, physics and earth and environmental science. Prerequisites may vary from one institution to another and there is some flexibility with entry levels and external study could also be on offer.

Employment Opportunities:

Cartographers can work within the tourist guide and street directory publishers, demographic marketing consultants, mining exploration companies, road mapping, conservation authorities, emergency services, local councils and many other areas. Bachelor of Fine Arts

The Bachelor of Fine Art degree is designed to impart the skills, knowledge and creative independence required to sustain a career as an artist.

This individual development requires a holistic approach to art education



- by students learning the skills and knowledge of the studio through studio practice under the guidance of established artists.

NAS has long been recognised for our use of this studio model of learning. The focus on small class sizes ensures that every student receives individual guidance and that their independent exploration of art making is informed by a comprehensive knowledge of the historical underpinnings of that practice as well as the dynamic range of contemporary possibilities for art practice today.

Master of Fine Arts

The Master of Fine Art (MFA) is a two-year full-time degree intended for BFA or equivalent graduates who wish to develop a higher level of specialised knowledge and further their professional expertise within their area of studio practice.

The Master of Fine Art degree involves a blend of coursework subjects, individual research and studio practice. Over the two years students engage in independent enquiry through studio practice and research toward the development of a major body of work and accompanying exegesis. The MFA continues the studio-based model of learning at NAS, centred on the development of individual practice under the guidance of established artists and the vital dialogue between theory and practice.

By the completion of the degree, students have developed a cohesive body of work reflecting the advances they have made in their practice. Studio Specialisations offered in the MFA are Ceramics, Drawing, Painting, Photomedia, Printmaking and Sculpture. Our MFA students are provided with individual studio spaces and access to workshop facilities in their chosen discipline.

Short Courses

Enrol in a National Art School short course and experience a unique visual arts education within a studio-based, practical approach to learning, taught by professional artists. These short courses are designed for people of all levels of experience—whether starting out as a beginner, contemplating a full-time fine arts degree, or practicing as an artist.

AFTER THE HSC

As you know, the next few months may be some of the most stressful for thousands of families in Australia, with students preparing to sit their final high HSC exams. The

reality is that often, despite hard work and focus, many students end up falling short of the mark they need to progress to the university course they had been dreaming of and pinning their hopes on.

The Pathways2uni team provide free student (and parent) counselling and assistance to help guide them through a range of alternative options and pathways.

The service is free domestic and International students, as they represent pathways programs into top universities, including UTS, USYD, ANU, CSU, WSU, UWA, La Trobe, Swinburne, James Cook, Bond University and many more.

How do you know a Pathways program is right for you or your child?

- Many of the programs available lead straight into second year of the corresponding University degree, meaning your son or daughter does not have to change too much of their original plan.
- FEE-HELP is available for Australian citizens.
- There are countless partner organisations, colleges and TAFE institutions which offer pathway programs to uni, plus they receive credit for their studies during the program.
- The majority of the programs ensure small class sizes, meaning your son or daughter will get more support and attention from lecturers and tutors.
- Pathways programs are flexible on completion students do not have to follow the path they may have chosen a year ago, but can still change their mind and pick from an endless list of degrees while getting credit for completing their pathways program!

Why a Bricklaying Apprenticeship?

A Bricklaying Apprenticeship is an industry recognised trade qualification (Certificate III) that provides the basis of many building and construction career opportunities, for example further study for a Certificate IV in Building and Construction leads to becoming a qualified builder. It also provides a stepping stone into other roles such as an estimator or leading hand. This apprenticeship is a competency based course, meaning the faster the apprentice learns, the quicker the apprenticeship is completed.

Bricklaying apprentices are paid while they learn: they are provided with a solid foundation of skills and knowledge supported for the duration of their training, by a professional network including their employer, the training organisation and ABBTF. ABBTF maintains an ongoing relationship with the employer and apprentice and works with both if a cancellation is likely or has happened.

A bricklaying apprenticeship has the advantage of providing a competitive wage on a par with other construction industry apprenticeships

Youth Jobs PaTH is a new, flexible program designed to prepare young people for work. It also encourages employers to trial a young person for a job by offering interns and financial incentives to reduce the cost of recruitment. Youth Jobs PaTH has three elements:

Prepare

Young people will be prepared for work through Employability Skills Training to help improve their chances of finding and keeping a job.

Trial

Employers can trial a young person in an internship for between 4 and 12 weeks.

Hire

Employers who hire an eligible young person can receive up to \$10,000 to help contribute to the costs of hiring and training.
