Career Hotspot ... Real Estate Salesperson

Real estate salespeople arrange the sale of houses, businesses, flats, factories, shops and farms on behalf of the owners.

Personal Requirements:

- good communication and negotiation skills
- good presentation and a pleasant manner



- able to network effectively
- strong sales focus
- good organisational skills and attention to detail

Education and Training:

To become a real estate salesperson you usually have to complete an accredited course in real estate or property. Entry to the courses below usually requires at least Year 10. As subjects can vary between institutions, you should contact

your chosen institution for full details. You may be able to study through distance education. You can also become a real estate salesperson through a traineeship in Property Services (Agency) or Property Services (Real Estate). Entry requirements may vary, but employers generally require Year 10. Ask your career adviser about the possibility of starting some of this training in school.

Employment Opportunities:

Employment opportunities for this occupation vary depending on the state of the real estate industry. The property market is very sensitive to the general state of the economy and factors such as government policy and interest rates. FACS Scholarships are now open

FACS is offering Scholarships to help students enrolled in education or training to complete their studies. Successful applicants will receive \$1,000 to help with education related expenses.

Applications for the 2018 FACS Scholarships are now open. Applications can be submitted via online application form.

Entries close 5pm, Friday 23 February 2018.

You are eligible to apply if you are:

-living in social housing (which includes public, community or Aboriginal housing), on the NSW Housing Register, receiving FACS private rental assistance, living in crisis/supported accommodation, or living in out-of-home care.

-studying in Year 10, 11 or 12 at a NSW high school or TAFE, completing a school based apprenticeship or traineeship, or studying a VET subject at school in 2018

- an Australian citizen or permanent resident.
- -not earning an income higher than the NSW social housing eligibility limits (if earning an income).

What can the scholarship funds be used for? Scholarship funds can be used for, but not limited to, purchasing educational materials or services including:

- -text books, workbooks, study guides and stationery
- -specialist equipment (e.g. art, music or photographic materials)
- -course costs (including materials), excursions, study -camps, sporting costs
- -computer software, printer, internet
- -childcare and transport
- -medical and support needs.
