Despite missing key players for the second week in a row, the seconds came out strong against a well-drilled Knox side and were able to grab an early lead on the back of some strong shooting from Darcy Mullins and Tom McMahon. While Knox fought back, Waverley did well to trade baskets for much of the first half. However, a sloppy final two minutes of the half allowed Knox to grab a 10-point lead at the break. Unfortunately, Waverley came out flat in the second half and struggled to keep up with the hosts. Waverley's lack of depth, due to injury, showed as Knox were able to take firm control of the game and to their credit, were able to slow Waverley down each time they began to make a run. The seconds eventually went down to Knox 47-25.

The firsts were hoping to repeat their thrilling Round one performance against Knox when they went down by twelve points. However, it was not to be, as Knox dominated all facets of the game for every period, totally outplaying Waverley to win by 93-41.

After a poor outing the previous week, the firsts were looking to redeem themselves against St Aloysius. And while their performance was a marked improvement on the game against Knox, Waverley was unable to get the better of St Aloysius in several critical areas including Field Goal Percentage, Rebounds, Assists and Points in the Paint eventually going down 88-76 in what was a winnable game.
