UAC Applications for 2022 are open

If you're a student in NSW or ACT and are thinking of studying at university in 2022, the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC) has announced that applications for undergraduate students has opened. You can apply for undergraduate courses, the Educational Access Scheme, Schools Recommendation Scheme, and Equity Scholarships.

UAC has emailed all students a UAC PIN, which is used along with your NESA number to login and access UAC's services. All semester 1, 2022 courses will be available from **August**.

Early bird applications will close at midnight on Thursday 30 September

Steps to completing your SRS application

Before you can apply for SRS, you need to apply for undergraduate admission through UAC. When you do, you'll be issued with a UAC application number, which you'll need to commence your SRS application.

There are no fees to apply for SRS, but there is processing fee when you apply for undergraduate admission through UAC.

- 1. Log in to the SRS application using your UAC application number and PIN. A series of questions and prompts will then guide you through the application process.
- 2. Enter your Year 11 studies, if prompted to do so in your application.
 - **Applicants in the NSW and ACT school systems**: You usually don't have to provide results of your Year 11 studies with your SRS application as UAC obtains them directly from the relevant educational authorities. If you are not prompted to enter your Year 11 studies or to provide documents there is no need to do so.
 - All other applicants: Enter the details of your Year 11 studies and upload a PDF of your Year 11 school report. If you don't have the PDF ready to upload when you first apply, upload it later by logging back in to SRS Check & Change (which you also access from the UAC website). You must upload your school report in order to have your studies assessed and considered by institutions as part of your SRS application. Uploaded documents cannot be edited or deleted but can be replaced up to three times.
- 3. Upload institution-specific documents, if required.
- 4. Review your application summary.
- 5. Accept the declaration.
- 6. Download your Confirmation of Application.

You can only submit one SRS application.

Nominating your course preferences

You don't need to nominate any courses in your SRS application because it is automatically linked to your list of course preferences in your UAC application for undergraduate admission.

The Edge Program allows you to receive a conditional offer to university based on more than your ATAR, before you even sit exams. Your application is based on your Year 11 results, with potential bonus points added for:

- Your portfolio outlining your passion for Engineering and IT
- Your STEM subject results

If your application is successful, you'll receive an early conditional offer to study either Engineering or IT at UTS in 2022. For your offer to become unconditional, you need to finish Year 12 with a minimum ATAR of 69.

Applications for the Edge Program open 10 August and close 12 September, so mark down the date and get your applications in ASAP.

ACU Guarantee – Applications Open Now

Applications to ACU's Early Entry Program, ACU Guarantee, are now open for 2022 admission.

How does it work?

By using your Year 11 results, ACU can predict a selection rank and make an offer accordingly. As part of your application you may also choose to provide personal statements that give ACU insight into your circumstances and motivation for university study to improve your entry score for ACU Guarantee. Tips for writing your personal statement are available here.

As part of ACU's commitment to removing barriers to university participation, the following factors will be considered alongside your academic results to calculate your predicted selection rank:

- Do you live in a rural or regional area?
- Are you attending a school that has a strong relationship with ACU?
- Do you identify as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander?
- Are you the first person in your family to attend university?

Students in Year 12 from around Australia are encouraged to apply. Offers will be made on a rolling basis from early July.

Macquarie University | COVID-19 Impact Points

Prospective students will not have to apply for these additional adjustment factors as they will be automatically applied via their Universities Admission Centre (UAC) application.

You may apply for and receive adjustment points from more than one admissions scheme (check each scheme for eligibility criteria) but some faculties at UTS apply a cap to the total number of adjustment points that you can receive for their courses:

Business - 10 point cap

Design, Architecture and Building; Engineering and IT – 13 point cap

University of Sydney Mathematics Prerequisites

The University has <u>mathematics course prerequisites</u> for some courses. This means that to study certain degrees, students will need to achieve a Band 4 in the NSW Higher School Certificate (HSC) Mathematics (not general mathematics) or <u>equivalent</u>.

- · If students don't meet the mathematics requirements, they may be able to:
- · complete the Mathematics MOOC (Massive Open Online Course) and exam
- apply for another course and then transfer into their preferred course in their second year (after successful completion of an accepted 1000 level mathematics unit).

UNSW HSC Maths Course Selection

While we encourage everyone to study the level of maths at which they feel sufficiently challenged, below are some guidelines for the minimum level of maths required for some of our degrees. Please also see Assumed Knowledge for more information. Studying at least HSC Mathematics Extension 1 will leave your options open when you choose your university degree. Knowledge of mathematics is a useful skill in any profession, even if it is not required for a particular course. No doubt, you will have to use mathematical tools such as graphs and statistics for the rest of your life. Learning mathematics also teaches you to approach problems in a systematic and logical way. Wanting to study medicine at university in 2022? You need to have booked your UCAT test date by now (and may have already even sat it already). And if you haven't already, it's time to start getting your applications in.

Applications for medicine degrees in Australia tend to close earlier than other courses. Some of them are coming up soon, so we've compiled a list of all the medicine courses and their closing dates, so you can make sure you don't miss out.

New South Wales

- <u>UNSW Bachelor of Medical Studies/Doctor of Medicine</u> apply through the Medicine Application Portal (MAP) and by UAC before 30 September 2021.
- <u>University of Newcastle/UNE Joint Medical Program</u> apply direct online and through UAC before 30 September 2021.
- <u>University of Sydney Bachelor of Science and Doctor of Medicine</u> apply through UAC before 30 September 2021.
- <u>WSU/CSU Joint Program in Medicine</u> apply through UAC between 1 August and 30 September 2021. Late applications will not be accepted.

Applying to University

Change of heart? Not a problem, just change your preferences

If you're in Year 12 and want to go to Uni next year, then you'll probably know that Term 3 is the time to start getting your applications organised. But did you also know that if you have a change of heart, it's not a problem, you can just change your preferences?

Before ATAR results are released

You can reorder your preferences any time.

You'll need the login and password details for the relevant account that you created when you originally applied.

Windows for changing your preferences

If you have received your ATAR results and you've done much better, or perhaps not as well, as you'd hoped. You can still change your preferences.

Bear in mind that the whole results-to-offers process moves quickly, so if you're thinking you might want (or have) to change your preferences then keep reading...

In each state, the ATAR results are released on different days and the main round of offers made through Tertiary Admissions Centres happen a couple of days after that. They always allow a period where you can change your preferences between receiving your ATAR and offers being made.

Say you do end up getting a lower ATAR than you expected. You could reorder your preferences and list a course with lower entry requirement first, you'll be more likely to receive an offer and you get to influence which course you'd like as your second option.

Or, if you did way better than expected, you can move a course with a higher selection rank to your top spot (just make sure you're not moving it because you can and that it's something that you do actually want to study).

Here's the dates you'll need to know if you don't want to miss that opportunity.

But wait... there's more

Didn't get an offer in the main rounds? Or maybe you did get an offer but it's not the one you wanted. Well, there's more good news – you still have time to change your preferences before the next rounds of offers, if you'd like to.

For example, if you got an offer but it's not your first preference and that's the one you really, really want, accept the offer you received and leave your preferences as they were. You might be offered a place for your first preference course in the next round of offers.

That can happen if somebody else doesn't accept an offer and a place becomes available for the next in line students (you).

You might have been offered your first preference but not be as excited about it as you ought to be, that's ok too. Again, you can accept your offer, reorder your preferences list for the next round of offers and see if you get another offer for the course you want.

These are the dates you'll need to know for the next round of offers:

State		Change of Preferences Closes for next round of offers round
NSW & ACT	<u>UAC</u>	By 11.59pm 6 January

Change your preferences even after you've accepted an offer

Say what? Yep, it's true – even if you received an offer in the main round, you can **still change your preferences.**

(If you get an offer, it's probably always best to accept it. That way, if you don't receive an offer in later rounds, you still have that option to fall back on).

For example:

- you receive an offer in main rounds for your first preference but have changed your mind about the course you want
- accept your offer
- reorder your preferences before the cut-off date (see above table or contact the TAC) for the next round, list the course you'd like to receive an offer for in first place
- wait to see what offers you get in the next round
- accept your new offer
- withdraw your enrolment from the first institution

Important Note: Make sure that you withdraw your enrolment for any offers that you no longer want, **before the census date** (check with the Uni if the information isn't in your offer email), otherwise you could end up paying two lots of fees.

What's the difference between a Bachelor of Business and Bachelor of Commerce?

Business vs Commerce

If you're keen to study business at university, you might already be looking into your future degree. And you also might have run into this conundrum – should I study a Bachelor of Business or a Bachelor of Commerce? You might even be wondering, are these two degrees even different?

We're here to answer your questions, and the first is, *yes*, there is a difference (we promise). Read on to find out more about the finer details on Business vs Commerce.

Business: broad knowledge

A Bachelor of Business is usually the first thing that comes to mind when you think about studying business at university. This is a common degree that you can study at pretty much any university in Australia, and for a good reason.

A Bachelor of Business equips you with the foundation skills you need to work in almost any industry and role. If you're not quite sure which area you'd like to specialise in, or you just want to be an all-round pro, a Bachelor of Business is an ideal choice.

As a general rule, you'll also learn more "people-centered" skills in a Bachelor of Business; think things like communication, management and leadership skills, marketing, and so on. These are core skills you can take into any role, setting you up for future success.

But if you do want to specialise, you can do that too. You can always take a major (or two) and really expand your horizons.

Business courses also tend to have slightly lower ATAR requirements, and only English as a prerequisite. They're also incredibly popular, so you won't have to go far to find a uni that offers this course.

Commerce: specialised knowledge

A Bachelor of Commerce is for those who really want to get into the nitty-gritty of a particular business area. These degrees tend to be much more thorough and in-depth, while focusing on a particular area.

A Bachelor of Commerce gives you specialist skills and knowledge in your chosen area. These degrees are more analytical, and commonly involve a bigger emphasis on mathematics. If you have a particular career path in mind, a Bachelor of Commerce can be a great way to learn the specific skills you need to get there.

Some common majors for a Bachelor of Commerce include things like <u>Business Economics</u> from UNSW.

Commerce courses can have slightly higher ATAR requirements, and also sometimes include mathematics as a prerequisite.

The similarities?

Although they have their differences, the Bachelor of Business and Bachelor of Commerce share some similarities as well.

Both are great at equipping you with the skills and knowledge you need for your future career. One isn't inherently "better" than the other, and what you learn in each will differ from university to university.

You might also see some universities offer the same major in both degrees – in this case, the content is usually largely the same and both degrees would be considered equally by employers. The things that might differ between the two degrees are other core subjects, and which electives you can choose to study.

The final decision

When making a decision about which course to study, the best course of action is to always do your research. Read the course information and handbook for each course carefully, and see if there is anything about a particular degree you do (or don't) like.

Job Spotlight - How to become a Police Officer

What do Police Officers do?

Police Officers help protect lives and property by enforcing laws and investigating crimes. Police Officers are highly trained specialists and have a wide variety of duties, including responding to emergencies, patrolling public areas, conducting criminal investigations and making arrests, and helping to maintain public order. If you are fit and resilient, hard-working with a strong sense of justice, and want a job that can be extremely challenging but rewarding, becoming a Police Officer could be perfect for you.

About you:

- Fit and strong
- Physically and emotionally resilient
- Passionate about helping people
- Strong sense of justice
- Confident and tough
- Can remain calm under pressure
- Great communicator
- Determined and capable

The job:

- Responding to emergency calls for help, such as accidents and crimes
- Investigating crimes and pursuing and arresting suspected offenders
- Maintaining public order at gatherings and events
- Providing assistance to victims of crime and their families
- Patrolling roads and enforcing traffic law
- Dealing with people who may be violent and unpredictable, or affected by alcohol and drugs

- This is a job where you may see some extremely confronting things, and can be very mentally challenging. You need to be emotionally resilient and prepared for any situation as a Police Officer.

How to become a Police Officer in Australia

The process of becoming a Police Officer in Australia can vary slightly in each State and Territory. Generally you only need to have finished Year 12 to become a recruit. You will need to be 18 years of age and hold a driver's license.
