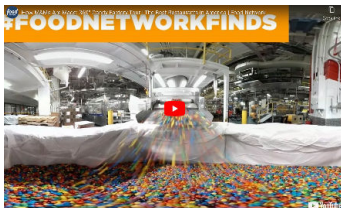
## Virtual Field Trip

Try to work out where each location is.

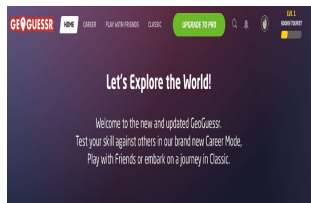
